to show off their achievement stickers. Every child who

had all 3 stickers was awarded a certificate declaring their

skills. The teacher and the Head master of the school

signed off on a sheet with the name of the children who

had achieved all the skills. The silent pact is that the teachers and the school authorities

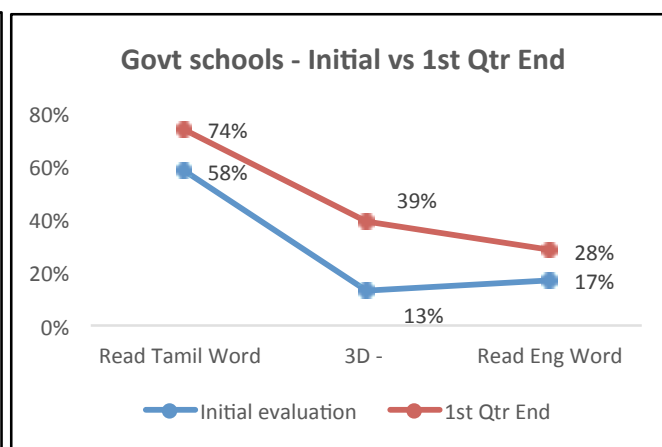
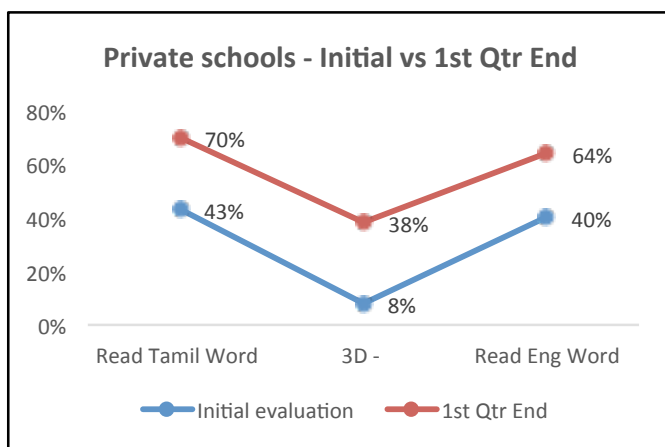
are aware that they will work on the lagging children too to ensure they achieve basic

Learnings from the field: Most Govt school teachers like our English Materials and methodology as compared to their own phonetic method which is more complex. Worksheets and workbooks are seen of great value by Govt school teachers. Private school teachers find our Tamil material very useful. They feel it is well graded and they are easily able to identify the skill levels in children.

Challenges faced: Since Govt schools teachers are busy with their admin work and trainings, they are not able to spend much time for taking classes with individual attention. Private schools have many restrictions on visits, so prior information and scheduling is required. Training of teachers takes a lot of time and we need to devise special ways to train young teachers. Further, methodology transfer across three levels is not very effective.

Plan ahead: For class 3, we will continue the last quarter skills in Tamil, Math and English. While, for class 4 and 5 children, we will start focusing on 2nd quarter skills. Tablets have been given to the field team to track skills through the Skill Chart app developed by Volunteers. We are in the process of finding out how best we can use the same to send updates. Videos for procedures in multiplication and division have been provided in the tablets to help teachers and EBTs get better idea on how to teach children these concepts

Young Teacher Model: As we had shared with you in the earlier newsletters, the results from the Young Teachers Model are quite encouraging. The data below shows a comparison between the % of children who can read Tamil words and do Subtraction in centers where there are Young Teachers vis-à-vis centers with no Young teachers. We will continue developing the Young Teacher model and providing adequate training to these students.
